

Ume Mincho (ume-tmo3.ttf from fonts-horai-umefont_610)

This Japanese font covers European languages written using a latin alphabet, except Azeri and Romanian, and the possible serbo-croat digraphs are missing. The Cyrillic alphabets are unusable because there is too much whitespace between the letters, similarly monotonic Greek which is also oblique. Japanese is of course supported, and Traditional Chinese (i.e. Mandarin, but not Cantonese). For variations of the latin, cyrillic, and greek alphabets I attempt to show the whole alphabet, followed by Article 1 of the UDHR (it is traditional!). For the other scripts and languages I merely display the digits (if not common 0..9) and Article 1.

Note: The latin, cyrillic and greek alphabets in my documents include non-break space characters (U+00A0) between the uppercase and lowercase variants of the same letter. In this font they appear as tildes, so the results are horribly messy.

In France there is also a requirement for a narrow no-break space character in punctuation, before ; ? ! » > and after « and < . On the web, a normal no-break space ‘~’ might be used. A narrow no-break space is also used in German for abbreviations ‘z. B.’

3 Quotation-marks, etc.

In real-world usage, particularly when looking at news sites, the presence or absence of the correct quote characters will make a difference. As a coder, I use '...' or "...". but in good text there are variations and this font supports:

left and right single quotes ‘...’ and right single quotes guillemets «...» and angle quotes <...>
left and right double quotes “...” and for traditional chinese and japanese
single turned comma, right single quote ‘...’ corner brackets 「...」 and white corner brackets 『...』
double low 9 and left double quotes ”...“

In Spanish languages, the inverted exclamation-mark ¡ and inverted question-mark ¿ are necessary.
